



Non-Citizen SNAP Eligibility

SNAP benefits are available to U.S. citizens
AND qualifying non-citizens!

SNAP Will Not Affect:

- An individual's immigration status
- Public charge determination - SNAP is not included in public charge tests
- Immigration sponsorship

Non-Citizens That May Qualify:

Non-citizens that may be eligible based on their immigration status must also meet regular SNAP eligibility criteria such as income and resource limits.

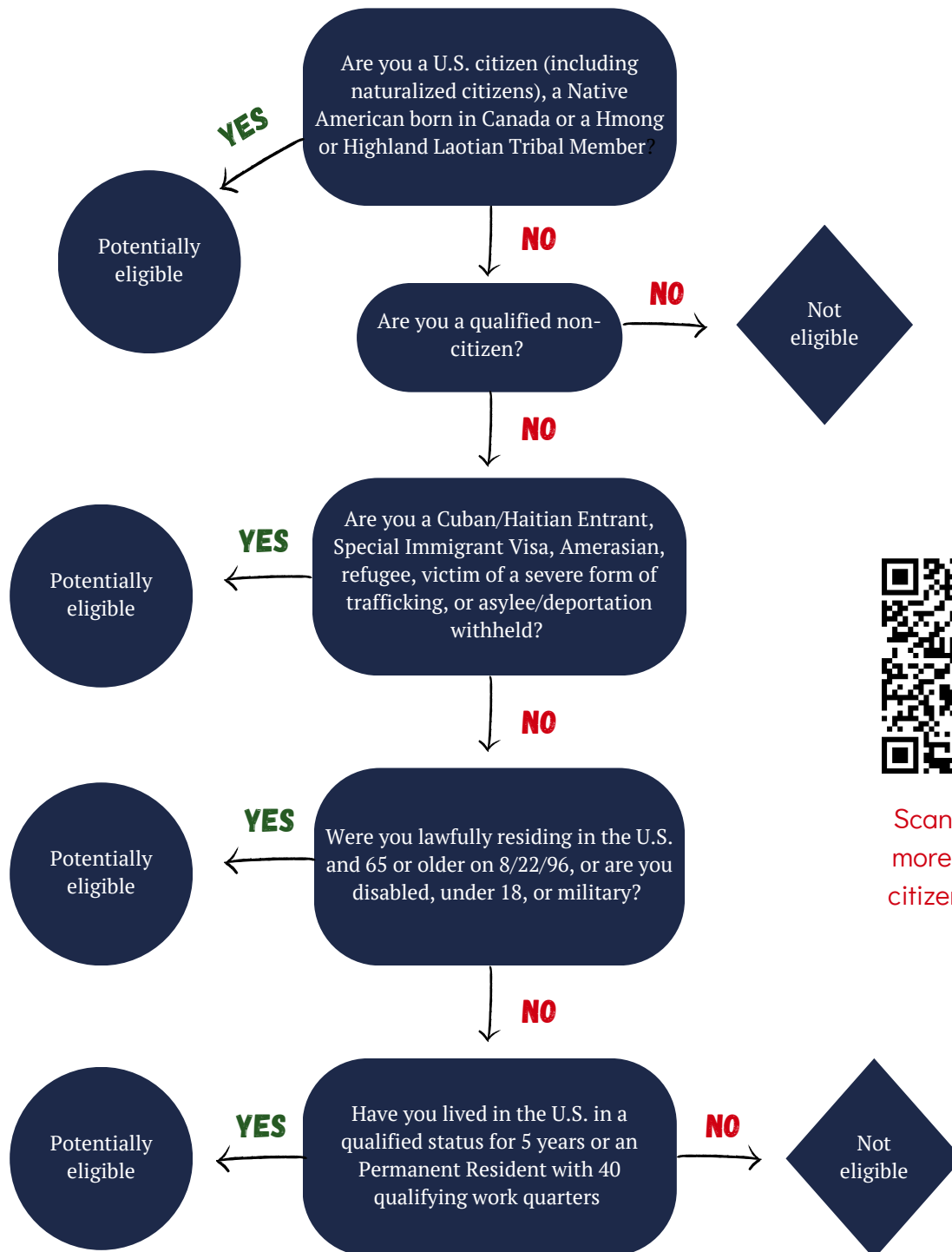
- Lawfully Admitted for Permanent Residence (LPRs)
- Asylees
- Parolees: Paroled for at least one year
- Deportation (or Removal) Withheld
- Conditional Entrants
- Cuban or Haitian Entrants
- Battered non-citizens
- Refugees
- Trafficking victims
- Iraqi and Afghan Special Immigrants
- Certain Native Americans born abroad
- Hmong or Highland Laotian tribal members
